# Referrals, Assessments and Children and Young People on Child Protection Registers: Year Ending 31 March 2005



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### Summary

#### Main findings for the year ending 31 March 2005

**1** Out of a total of 552,000 referrals to social services departments, 121,800 (22%) were repeat referrals that had previously been made within the last year. This compares with 127,400 (22%) out of a total of 572,700 in the year ending 31 March 2004. This year has seen a drop in the number of referrals. In recent years the number of referrals has remained fairly stable at around 570,000

**2** Of the 290,300 initial assessments completed in the year, 179,200 (62%) were completed within 7 working days of referral. This compares with 169,100 (58%) out of a total of 290,800 for the previous year.

**3** Of the 74,100 core assessments undertaken in the year, 49,700 (67%) were completed within 35 days (PAF C64). This compares with 39,400 (62%) out of a total of 63,600 for the previous year

4 There were 25,900 children on child protection registers at 31 March 2005, 1% fewer than a year earlier and 26% fewer than in 1995 (see chart below)

5 The 2005 figure represents 23 children per 10,000 of the population aged under 18 compared with 24 last year. This compares with 27 children per 10,000 of the population aged under 18 for 5 years ago and 32 children per 10,000 in 1995.

**b** There were 30,700 additions to the registers (registrations) during the year ending 31 March 2005 and 31,100 children were de-registered over this same period. This was a decrease of 2% for registrations and a decrease of 1% for de-registrations in comparison with the previous year.

7 13% of children registered during 2004–05 had previously been registered (PAF A3) – the same percentage as 2003–04. This compares with 14% five years ago.


**9** 79% of looked after children who were on registers were in foster placements and 13% were placed with their own parents. These percentages are exactly the same as in 2004 but differ from five years ago when 72% of looked after children were in foster placements and 18% were placed with their own parents.

**10** 43% of registrations related to children considered to be at risk of neglect. Emotional abuse accounted for 19% of registrations followed by physical abuse (18%) and sexual abuse (9%). Mixed categories made up the remaining 12%. With the exception of "neglect" (which have increased from 39% to 43% of all registrations) these proportions have generally been consistent for the last 4 years.

**11** 6% of children removed from the register had been on it for over 2 years (PAF C21) – this compares with 7% for the previous year, 11% five years ago and 17% in 1995.

12 99% of child protection cases which should have been reviewed during the year were reviewed (PAF C20) – This compares with 95% of all cases for 2003–04 and 87% for the period 2000–01.

### Commentary

#### Background to the statistical collection

1 The return for the year ending 31 March 2005 represents the seventeenth regular collection of information about Child Protection Registers from local authorities in England – the first being for the year ending 31 March 1989. The figures in this publication are based on statistical returns from all 150 local authorities with social services responsibilities.

2 The Children Act 1989, implemented in October 1991, radically revised the legal framework under which local authority social services departments' work to provide services for children. *"Working Together Under the Children Act 1989"*, the guidance to arrangements for the protection of children, was produced in October 1991. This included revisions to procedures, terminology and register categories.

3 In December 1999, the Department of Health issued a revision of "Working Together Under the Children Act 1989". The guidance "Working Together to Safeguard Children" retains the four existing registration categories with the exception of a minor change where the physical injury category has become physical abuse. The new Working Together to Safeguard Children to be issued in 2006 is not proposing to make any changes to these categories

**4** A copy of the collection form CPR3 that is the basis of the information presented in this publication is included at Appendix A. It contains tables used to collect details of children on the register at 31 March 2005, their legal status (if any), and the placement category of children who were looked after by local authorities. Other tables on the form collect details of registrations; also whether they were first registrations or re-registrations; de-registrations, and numbers of children who were the subject of s.47 enquiries and initial child protection conferences during the year ending 31 March 2005.

5 Authorities keep register records in different ways and in some cases information needs to be collected from different sources. Some authorities maintain a centralised register, while others collect information from several sub-areas. Many authorities now maintain computer-based registers but others continue to rely on manual systems.

#### **1** INTRODUCTION

#### Data quality

**1.1** The reader should bear in mind that the great variability between councils shown in some of the figures presented here may be a result of local differences in the interpretation of the definitions of the

data categories, rather than accurately reflecting differences in local social services practice.

#### **Basis of definitions**

**1.2** The data categories used to gather information about the referral and assessment process are based on definitions and procedures outlined in the *Framework* for the Assessment of Children in Need and their Families, published jointly by the Department of Health, the Home Office and the Department for Education and Skills (DfES) in 2000. In the rest of this Commentary that follows, this document is referred to as the 'Assessment Framework'.

**1.3** In this regard the CPR3 covers some of the same ground as the Children in Need (CiN) census, a biennial census of all children receiving a service from a social services department during the nominated census week.

**1.4** The census has been carried out four times so far, in February 2000, September/October 2001, February 2003 and February 2005. It classifies child-related social services activity into three phases of work:

- Intake and referral;
- Initial work;
- Ongoing work.

The first of these categories broadly reflects the 'Referral' data category collected on CPR3; the second reflects the 'Initial Assessment' category. The 'Ongoing work' category of the CiN census subsumes the other data categories on the CPR3, with the proviso that the majority of children recorded by the CiN census do not receive 'Core Assessments' or enter the child protection system, and so fall outside the scope of these CPR3 data categories.

**1.5** Some of the children who are referred to social services go on to be 'looked after'. Again this is a discrete sub-group of Children in Need. There is a small overlap between children who are looked after and children who are on child protection registers (3,000 as at 31 March 2005). *Figure 1.1* illustrates the relationship between these groups.

#### Notes to Figure 1.1


Total CiN includes 151,600 open cases which involved no social services activity in census week.

The total for children looked after excludes those subject to an agreed series of short-term placements ('respite care').

The total on the child protection registers includes 310 unborn children.

#### 2. REFERRALS OF CHILDREN TO SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENTS

(Tables 1A and 7A)

**2.1** A referral is defined for the purposes of CPR3 as 'a request for services to be provided by the social services department.' This is in respect of a case where the child is not previously known to the council, or where the case was previously open but is now closed. A referral can be made by a professional from one of many different agencies (typically in the health and education sectors) but the term as used here is a broad one which encompasses referrals from any source, including self-referrals. The figures collected on CPR3 do not attempt to identify or distinguish between the source of referral.

**2.2** A distinction should be drawn between *referrals*, and activities which can be described as *reception and initial contact*. Not all initial contacts will go on to lead to a referral; for example a request to social services (in person or over the phone) for information or advice which is dealt with and does not require any follow-up action is not counted as a referral.


**2.3** Where more than one person has contacted a social services department around the same time and about the same child, only one referral will be counted.

**2.4** Where a case is closed, and there is a new referral of that child to social services, this will be counted in the figures presented here as a new referral. This means that some children may be counted more than once in these figures.

**2.5** This information is presented in tables 1A and 7A, which show that in the year ending 31 March 2005 22% of all referrals were repeat referrals made within a year. This overall percentage disguises a range of variation between figures reported for individual councils (table 7A).

**2.6** The same table shows referrals expressed as a rate per 10,000 of the local population aged 0-17. Expressing data in this way provides a means to compare the incidence of referrals between councils. Although the England mean is 499 per 10,000, there is a very wide range of variation between councils, ranging from 4% of councils reporting a referral rate of less than 200 per 10,000, to 6% reporting a referral rate of over 1,000 per 10,000 (*Figure 2.1*). 65% of councils reported a referral rate between 200 and 600 per 10,000.

**2.7** It is possible that some of these rates reflect local differences in interpretation of what constitutes a referral.

#### **3** ASSESSMENTS

#### Initial Assessments (Tables 1A, 7B)

**3.1** An initial assessment is defined as a brief assessment of any child who has been referred to social services with a request that services be provided. An initial assessment is deemed to have started either at the point of referral to a social services department, or when new information on an open case indicates that an initial assessment should be repeated.

**3.2** Initial assessments may lead to three types of outcome:

- no further action;
- the immediate provision of services;
- a more detailed type of assessment (known as a 'core assessment') being carried out. This may be carried out even where there is immediate provision of services.

**3.3** Table 1A shows that 290,300 initial assessments were carried out in England during the year 31 March

2005. Where a child underwent more than one initial assessment in the year to 31 March, each occasion has been counted; the figure also includes unborn children.

**3.4** Table 1A also shows that 62% of initial assessments were completed within seven working days of the referral. This data category relates to a government objective for children's social services which requires that the initial assessment of all children in need, regardless of whether there are child protection concerns, should be completed within a maximum of seven working days of the referral<sup>1</sup>.

**3.5** Table 7B gives details at local council level which demonstrates considerable variation between councils in the percentage completed within 7 working days, with some extreme outliers (Sutton reporting 21% completed within 7 working days, and Kent reporting 100%). The national figure is 62%.

3.6 Table 7B also expresses initial assessments as a percentage of total referrals in the year. Nationally, 53% of referrals led to initial assessments. At a local council level however, reported figures show considerable variation, including some below 20% (which suggests that the vast majority of referrals did not lead to assessments), to 100% (which suggests that every referral led to an initial assessment. It also means there were no initial assessments which took place due to changed circumstances rather than as a result of a referral). The reader should treat the figures in this column of table 7B with some caution, as some of the reported variation may reflect local differences in interpretation of data categories on the CPR3, problems collecting accurate data or in some cases clearing backlogs that had built up during the previous year.

#### Core Assessments (Tables 1A, 7C)

**3.7** A core assessment is defined as an in-depth assessment which addresses the central or most important aspects of the child's needs. There are several junctures at which a core assessment may start, depending on the child's circumstances, and the existence of child protection concerns ('risk of significant harm') is not a pre-requisite. The expected timescale for the completion of a core assessment is a maximum of 35 working days, recognising that where specialist assessments are required they may not take place within this timescale<sup>2</sup>.

**3.8** Table 1A shows that 74,100 core assessments were undertaken in England in the year to 31 March, of which 49,700 (67% of all core assessments) were completed within 35 days. Where a child underwent more than one core assessment in the year to 31 March, each occasion

has been counted; the figure also includes unborn children.

**3.9** Table 7C shows the percentage of core assessments completed within 35 days of initial assessments. Again there is great variability between councils, suggesting differences in interpretation or data quality problems. Where an alternative 'trigger event' other than the completion of an initial assessment has led to a core assessment, the 35 days should be counted from the date of the trigger event.

**3.10** Table 7C also expresses the total number of core assessments completed by each council as a rate per 10,000 of the local population. This shows an extreme range of variation in rates between councils, between a reported 12 per 10,000 in Liverpool, to 395 per 10,000 in Bradford. Reasons for this wide range may be either local differences in practice, or differences between councils in their understanding of what constitutes a core assessment, or problems in the collection of accurate data. Comments about the numbers of core assessments received from data suppliers suggest that all of these factors have come into play. The national figure is 67%.

#### 4 SECTION 47 ENQUIRIES AND INITIAL CHILD PROTECTION CONFERENCES

 $(Tables\,2A,2B,8A,8B\,and\,8C)$ 

**4.1** Where there is any suspicion that a child may be suffering or is likely to suffer significant harm, social services departments are required by section 47 of the Children Act 1989 to make enquiries to establish whether there is a need for further action to safeguard the child's welfare.

**4.2** While the exact order of stages of the process may depend on circumstances, an early action consists of convening a strategy discussion involving relevant professionals. Amongst other things this discussion should decide if enquiries under s.47 should be initiated, or should be continued if they have already begun<sup>3</sup>. If a core assessment has not already started, it should be initiated with the s.47 enquires as this is the means by which a s.47 enquiry is carried out.

**4.3** Enquiries under s.47 may involve a number of agencies or professionals involved with the child and his or her family. If child protection concerns are substantiated and the child is judged to be at continuing risk of significant harm, an initial child protection conference should be convened no more than fifteen working days after the strategy discussion that initiated the s.47 enquiries.

**4.4** The figures presented here for s.47 enquiries and conferences include those in respect of unborn children.

Where a group of siblings were considered together, each child who was the subject of the s.47 enquiries or an initial child protection conference has been counted separately. If a child was the subject of s.47 enquiries or an initial child protection conference more than once in the year to 31 March, each occasion will have been counted.

**4.5** Tables 2A and 8A show that an estimated 68,500 children were the subject of s.47 enquiries which started in the year to 31 March 2005. Over half this number (37,400) were the subject of an initial child protection conference during the year, of which 20,500 (55%) were conferences held within 15 working days of the start of the s.47 enquiries which led to the conference.

#### Core assessments and s.47 figures

**4.6** For the first time in 4 years, national figures show that the total core assessments completed in the year (74,100) are higher than the total figure for s.47 enquiries (68,500). At a local level there are still some councils that have more s47 enquiries than core assessments. This suggests there has been some underreporting or practice does not accord with government guidance.

**4.7** As mentioned above, Government Guidance states that a core assessment is the means by which a s.47 enquiry is carried out and it should, therefore, be commenced at the point the s.47 enquiries are initiated if a core assessment is not already underway. Given that core assessments will also be carried out in respect of many other children in need for whom there are no child protection concerns, it is reasonable to expect the total reported core assessments to exceed the total reported s.47 enquiries.

**4.8** Illustrated below are the comparative totals of each stage in the referral and assessment process as in *Figure* 4.1. This shows that the number of referrals and initial assessments of children in need of a service greatly exceeds the number for whom there are child protection concerns.

#### Section 47 enquiries:

Tables (2A and 2B)

**4.9** Table 2B compares this year's total of 68,500 section 47 enquiries with a total of 72,100 for the year ending 31 March 2004.

**4.10** Table 8A expresses s.47 enquiries started in the year as a rate per 10,000 children. The England average is 62 per 10,000. Individual local authority figures show great variation, from 19 per 10,000 in Bath and North East Somerset to 261 per 10,000 in Hartlepool. Such extreme variation may be a result of differences in collection methods or interpretation of guidance rather than reflecting a true variation in the incidence of child protection concerns in their respective areas.


#### **Initial Child Protection conferences**

 $(Table \, 2A \, and \, 2B)$ 

**4.11** Where concerns about a child's welfare are substantiated and the agencies most involved judge that a child may continue to suffer, or be at risk of suffering significant harm, the social services department should convene an initial child protection conference. During the year 2004-05 around 37,400 initial child protection conferences were carried out; the purpose of which is to draw together the information that has been obtained and to make judgements on whether the child is at continuing risk of significant harm and whether he or she, therefore requires a child protection plan to be put in place. Since 2001-02 this information has been collected on a different basis to previous years. It is set out in the inter-agency guidance "Working Together to Safeguard Children" that an initial child protection conference should take place within 15 working days of the strategy discussion which decided whether s.47 enquiries should be initiated or continued if they have already begun. During the year ending 31 March 2005, it is estimated that 20,500 (or 55%) of the 37,400 initial conferences took place within 15 days of the initiation of the enquiries.

## Initial Child protection conferences – time series $(Table \ 2B)$

**4.12** Table 2B provides the annual totals for initial child protection conferences in the form of a time series. From a peak of 48,100 in 1994–1995 this figure fell in subsequent years to 34,100 in 2000–01. This looked like the start of an upturn in figures, as the number of Initial Child Protection Conferences increased each year and rose back up to 38,500 in 2003–04. However, this number dropped again by 3% to 37,400 in 2004–05.

#### Children subject to a conference and registered

(Tables 2B and 8C)

**4.13** Table 2B also displays the number of registrations to child protection registers in the year, and expresses that figure as a percentage of initial child protection conferences. As registration cannot take place without being preceded by a conference, this figure can be regarded as the percentage of conferences which led to registration. This percentage has risen steadily in recent years apart from the drop last year when the percentage of conferences which led to registrations dropped slightly to 80%. For 2004–05 this percentage rose again to 82%.

**4.14** Table 8C is a time series for local authorities which compares across successive years the number of children who were subject to an initial child protection conference, and of these the percentage that did <u>not</u> go on to be registered. This figure is an estimate, calculated by taking the total registrations in the year away from the total number who were subject to a conference. This totals some 6,700 children in all (or 18%), and represents the difference between the last two bars on the right of figure 4.1.

#### 5 SUMMARY OF REGISTRATION ACTIVITY

(Table 3A)

**5.1** At 31 March 2005 there were 25,900 children and young people on child protection registers in England,

1% fewer than a year earlier. This represents a rate of 23 children per 10,000 in the population aged under 18. As can be seen in Figure 5.1 the numbers on the register reached over 38,000 in 1992 (before the implementation of the *Children Act 1989* had made an impact on the figures) but then fell sharply over the following year. The numbers were relatively stable until 1999. The numbers on child protection registers then fell steadily until 2002, rose slightly in 2003 but then fell again in 2004 and 2005. In 1999 Working Together raised the threshold for registration by changing the criteria to continuing risk of harm and requiring a child protection plan to be put in place, rather than had suffered or was likely to suffer significant harm.

**5.2** The number of additions to the registers (registrations) during the year was 30,700 and correspondingly there were 31,100 de-registrations. In population terms this translates to 28 per 10,000 under 18's for registrations and de-registrations. Recent trends in these series are also illustrated in Figure 5.1

#### 6 CHILDREN ON CHILD PROTECTION REGISTERS AND REGISTRATIONS

#### Gender

(Tables 3A, 4A to 4C)

**6.1** There were more boys on the register than girls at 31 March 2005. Although more boys than girls were on the register, the rates of registration are the same for both sexes (23 per 10,000) as Table 3A shows; this is because there are more boys than girls in the population aged under 18.


#### Age

 $(Tables\,3B,\,4A\,to\,4C\,and\,5B)$ 

**6.2** At 31 March 2005 3,000 children on the register were under one year of age, 12% of the total, a proportion which has risen slowly over the previous decade (Table 3B). At the other end of the age range 490 children or 2% were aged 16 or over; this number has been falling

#### FIGURE 5.1:


Registrations and de-registrations during the years ending 31 March 1992 to 2005 and the numbers on the register at 31 March



steadily. These proportions are illustrated in Figure 6.1 below.

**6.3** Table 4C shows that children aged under one had the highest rate on the register (51 per 10,000 children in that age group). The rate was lower for the age group one to four (33 per 10,000) and continues to decline up the age range, falling to 4 per 10,000 for children aged 16 and over. For children becoming registered during the year, the pattern was similar although the rate for children aged under 1 was higher at 83 per 10,000 children in that age group. (see Table 5B and Figure 6.2).

#### **Categories of abuse**

(Tables 3C, 4A to 4C and 5C)

**6.4** Authorities are asked to classify children on the register according to one of five categories of abuse. Prior to 2002, mixed categories could be recorded. Since 2001–02 a multiple category was added to the form. A child suffering from more than one type of abuse would fall into this category.

**6.5** Similar patterns are seen whether one considers children on the register at 31 March (Table 3C) or children registered during the year (Table 5C). Neglect is the most frequently used category, accounting for 43% of children registered during 2004–05. The percentages in the category neglect had steadily increased. The number

of cases of emotional abuse over the last three years has shown a steady increase. In contrast the use of the categories physical injury/abuse and sexual abuse has generally fallen.

### Looked after children on the register $(Table \ 3D)$

**6.6** Table 3D shows the number of children on the register who were also looked after by their local authority. At 31 March 2005, 3,000 (12% of those on the register) were looked after by local authorities. This figure represents 5% of all children looked after at that date.

**6.7** 47% of these looked after children on the register were subject to care orders, with the majority of the remainder looked after under voluntary agreements. 79% were accommodated in foster placements, a higher proportion than that for all looked after children, with a further 4% in children's homes or secure units and 13% placed with parents. The remaining 3% are made up of children who are missing from their agreed placement, placed for adoption, in independent living arrangements, residential employment, residential care homes, residential schools or other residential settings (e.g. mother and baby unit, family centre, young offenders institution).


## Age and gender patterns by category of abuse $(Tables \; 4A \; to \; 4C)$

**6.8** During the 2004–2005 year, there were more girls on the child protection register in connection with sexual abuse than boys. Sexual abuse accounted for 11% of girls on the register at 31 March 2005 and 8% of boys (see Table 4B). The rate was 2 per 10,000 for both girls and boys in the population (see Table 4C).

**6.9** In contrast there were more boys than girls on the register in connection with physical abuse, although the percentage of both boys and girls registered in connection with physical abuse was the same at 15%.

Ethnic Origin (Table 4D)

**6.10** Of the 25,900 children on child protection registers 81% were of a white background, 7% of a mixed background, 5% Black or Black British, 4% Asian or Asian British and 1% were unborn on 31 March 2005. The remainder were of other ethnic origins.

#### 7 RE-REGISTRATIONS

#### (Table 5A)

**7.1** Of the 30,700 registrations in the year ending 31 March 2005, 4,100 (13%) were re-registrations, i.e. children who had been on the register previously. Figure 7.1 demonstrates the recent trends

**7.2** In November 1998 the Department of Health established 're-registrations to child protection registers' as a performance indicator of children's social services under the Quality Protects Programme, and since then has been adopted as indicator A3 of the Performance Assessment Framework (PAF).

**7.3** Information on the number of re-registrations which occurred within one year of the last

#### FIGURE 7.1: Numbers of re-registrations during the years ending 31 March 1995 to 2005


de-registration has been collected for the last five years. Nationally this figure stands at 30% of all re-registrations, but varies greatly between authorities.

#### 8 LENGTH OF TIME ON THE REGISTER

(Tables 6A - 6C)


**8.1** Information was collected regarding the lengths of time spent on the register by children who were deregistered. During the year ending 31 March 2005, around 10,100 children (33%) had been on the register for under six months, and 1,900 (6%) had been on the register for two years or more. The equivalent percentages a year earlier were 33% and 7% respectively. As can be seen in Figure 8.1, the percentage of children leaving the register who had been on it for more than two years has fallen over the last ten years. This measure has been established as indicator C21 under the Performance Assessment Framework (PAF).

**8.2** PAF Indicators A3 (see paragraph 7.2) and C21 should be considered together, since it is possible for a local authority to achieve a low re-registration rate by retaining a high proportion of children on the register for a long time, or vice versa.

#### **TECHNICAL NOTES**

### 1 Rounding and Suppression of very small Numbers

**1.1** To ensure that no individual can be identified from statistical tables, conventions are in place in this publication for the rounding and suppression of very small numbers.

#### National tables

**1.2** For this reason, all numbers which appear in the national summary tables have been rounded to the nearest 100 if they exceed 1,000, and to the nearest 10 otherwise. Numbers from 1 to 5 inclusive have been suppressed, being replaced in the table by a hyphen (-). In making the percentage calculation, where the numerator was 5 or less, or the denominator was 10 or less, they have been suppressed and replaced by a hyphen (-).

#### Local tables

**1.3** At local council level the England total numbers at the head of each table have been rounded either to the nearest 10 or 100, following the rule outlined above. All regional totals and column totals which show all categories have been rounded to the nearest five, as have LA figures for tables displaying time series only. Numbers from 1 to 5 inclusive have been suppressed, being replaced in the published table by a hyphen.

**1.4** Where a percentage is zero because the number from which that percentage has been calculated is a zero, the percentage is shown as zero.

**1.5** In tables which include time series figures, the latest year, 2005, has been rounded to the nearest 5 as with the previous years for the sake of consistency.

**1.6** It has been necessary to suppress other figures whenever it would be possible to calculate the value of a suppressed number by means of simple arithmetic. The rule applied in these circumstances has been to suppress

the next smallest data item.

**1.7** In addition, all information concerning the City of London, Isles of Scilly and Rutland, has been included this year. Due to the very small numbers of children on the child protection register in these councils in previous years the figures have been suppressed with a hyphen.

**1.8** The following symbols have been used in the tables:

- 0 Zero
- Small number suppressed to preserve confidentiality. Normally this will be a number between 1 and 5 inclusive, or a percentage where either the numerator is 5 or less, or the denominator is 10 or less.

#### DEFINITIONS OF PAF INDICATORS

#### A3: Re-registrations on the Child Protection Register

Numerator:

Of the children in the denominator, the number of children who had previously been on the Child Protection Register of that council. New councils that were created by local government re-organisation should include children who were previously on the register of the old council.

Denominator: The number of children registered to the Child Protection Register at any time during the year ending 31 March.

#### NOTES:

It is possible for an individual child to be re-registered by the same council more than once in the statistical year. In such circumstances each occasion of re-registration should be counted in the **numerator**, in line with Table 7. Likewise the **denominator** is a count of each occasion of registration in the year, and may count the same child more than once.

As presently defined, the indicator takes into account any previous occasion on which a child was on your council's Child Protection Register, even if it was many years ago.

Numerator: Of the children in the denominator, the number of children whose cases had been reviewed, so that:

- the first review of the year was held within 6 months of the last review in the previous year (or within 3 months of the child being replaced on the register, if there was no review in the previous year)
- ii) the maximum gap between reviews during the year was 6 months; and
- iii) a review was held within 6 months of the end of the year (ie on or after 1 October)

Denominator: N

: Number of children on the Child Protection Register at 31 March who at that date had been on the register continuously for at least the previous 3 months.

#### NOTES:

6 months' means 6 calendar months.

Year' means a statistical year, which runs from 1 April to 31 March inclusive.

To be counted in the **numerator** the maximum gap between reviews for a child on the register should be no longer than 6 months. Therefore if a child's first review took place on 1 October or later, ther must have been a gap of over 6 months since their last.

To be counted in the **denominator**, a child must have been on the register continuously since 1 October or earlier."

A review should be recorded in writing and should consider the childís safety, health and development against the intended " outcomes set out in the child protection plan.

#### C21: Duration on the Child Protection Register

Numerator: Of the children in the denominator, the number who had been on the register continuously for two year or longer (i.e. for more than 729 days including day of de-registration).

#### NOTES

Although it is possible for an individual child to be de-registered by the same council more than once in the statistical year, this is not possible if the duration on the register was two years or more. So the same child cannot appear more than once in the **numerator** of C21.

However the **denominator** does count an individual child more than once, if they were de-registered more than once in the statistical year.

If a child and his/her family move permanently to the area of another council, the receiving council should convene a child protection conference within 15 working days (see 'Working Together' para. 5.93). Only after this conference has taken place should de-registration from the originating council's Register take place.

#### C64: The proportion of Core Assessments that were completed within 35 working days of their commencement.

Numerator:	<ul> <li>Of the core assessments in the denominator, the number that had been completed with 35 working days of their commencement. A core assessment is deemed to have commenced at the point at which <ul> <li>the initial assessment ended; or</li> <li>strategy discussion decided to initiate enquires under section 47 of the Children Act 1989; or</li> <li>new information obtained on an open case indicates that a core assessment should be undertaken.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Core assessments are the means by which s 47 enquiries are carried out (following a strategy discussion).</li> </ul>
Denominator:	The total number of core assessments of children receiving core assessments in the year. If a child undergoes a core assessment more than once in the year, count each core assessment that finished during the year separately

Denominator: Total number of children de-registered from the Child Protection Register during the year ending 31 March.
